Northstowe Muslims Islamic Classes First Aid Policy

1. Introduction

Northstowe Muslims Islamic Classes is committed to ensuring the health and safety of all students, staff, and visitors. This First Aid Policy outlines the procedures for responding to medical emergencies and providing appropriate first aid support.

2. Aims

- To provide immediate and appropriate first aid care in the event of illness or injury.
- To ensure staff are trained and equipped to handle medical emergencies.
- To maintain accurate records of incidents and first aid treatment.

3. Responsibilities

a. Management Team

- A list of students with medical conditions will be maintained and accessible to staff.
- Medication should only be administered by trained staff with parental consent.

- In case of a serious emergency, 999 will be called immediately.
- The nearest first aider will provide assistance until emergency services arrive.
- Parents/guardians will be contacted as soon as possible.

9. Training

- Designated first aiders will receive certified training and regular refresher courses.
- All staff will be briefed on first aid procedures during induction.
